

Scottish Ballet make their Linbury Theatre premiere in March 2020 with a double bill, *This is My Body...*

- Scottish Ballet presents a contemporary, cutting-edge double bill of work in the Linbury Theatre.
- This is My Body... features contrasting works: MC 14/22 (Ceci est mon corps) by Angelin Preljoçaj and Sibilo from Sophie Laplane.

After their hugely successful 50th anniversary year in 2019, Scotland's national dance company **Scottish Ballet** make their first visit to the Linbury Theatre at the Royal Opera House this spring, presenting a pioneering double bill of work which showcases the bold, adventurous spirit of the Company.

This is My Body... includes MC 14/22 (Ceci est mon corps) choreographed by Angelin Preljoçaj and Sibilo choreographed by Scottish Ballet's Resident Choreographer, Sophie Laplane. This bill celebrates and tests the power and versatility of dancers' bodies, and is presented in the unique, intimate surroundings of the Linbury Theatre, The Royal Ballet's international stage for dance.

MC 14/22 is a powerful and passionate work that draws inspiration from St. Mark's version of The Last Supper and is created for twelve male dancers with soundscapes by Tedd Zahmal. Sibilo is a surreal work featuring an ensemble of eight dancers, with a soundtrack created by Scottish electronic DJ and music producer Alex Menzies (aka Alex Smoke), and movement inspired by everyday emotions and situations.

CEO/Artistic Director of Scottish Ballet, **Christopher Hampson**, comments: '2019 was an incredibly exciting year for Scottish Ballet as we celebrated our 50th anniversary. It is fitting to open our 2020/21 season with *This is My Body*, making our Linbury Theatre debut. This

cutting-edge double bill showcases our daring and unique style, presenting the work of an iconic choreographer alongside our own homegrown talent.'

Creative Producer for The Royal Ballet, **Emma Southworth**, adds: 'I'm delighted to be welcoming Scottish Ballet to the Linbury Theatre for the first time with this really exciting double bill of contemporary work. Both *MC 14/22* and *Sibilo* showcases Company's dynamic artistry, as well as the powerfully contrasting work of two innovative choreographers in Angelin Preljoçaj and Sophie Laplane.'

This is My Body... will be presented at The Joyce Theater in New York from 10–15 March, before opening at The Linbury Theatre in London from 31 March-3 April.

Sibilo is being presented in London and New York thanks to the generous support of Sir Sandy & Lady Crombie.
